Which league should we enter?

Please see below guidance on each league to help select which competition/s you wish to enter.

Kirby Shield (Mixed Year 5/6)	Kirby Plate (Mixed Year 5/6)	Tony Moore Shield (Girls' Year 5/6)	Tony Moore Plate (Girls' Year 5/6)
Excel – For the strongest teams in the area to play in. All players should understand and be able to play football and likely play in clubs outside of school.	Excel – For teams who aren't as strong to play in, still competitive but likely to consist of smaller schools with a smaller pool of players to select from. Majority of players are able to play football and likely play in clubs outside of school.	Excel – For the strongest teams in the area to play in. Majority of players should have some idea how to play football/play outside of school.	Develop – To allow players the chance to play competitive games in an appropriate environment. Majority of the team are new players/girls who only play in school & not in a club setting.

- Schools can only enter into EITHER the Kirby Shield (Div 1) or the Kirby Plate (Div 2).
- Schools can enter into BOTH the Tony Moore Shield (Div 1) and the Tony Moore Plate (Div 2), or can choose to enter just one.
- By entering the Kirby or Tony Moore competitions, your players and spectators are agreeing to adhere to the code of conduct below. Failure to do so may result in your team being removed from the competition. You must also share this code of conduct with all players and parents.

There is no progression from the Plate to the Shield in either league.

- 7 players on pitch including goalkeeper, rolling subs are allowed from your squad of 10. The referee must be informed of any changes that are made. <u>Please note</u> the squad size must not be exceeded.
- League group games to be 20 minutes each way (knockout stages- if in the event of a draw after normal time, 5 minutes each way of extra time. If still tied then 5 penalties per team with sudden death to follow.)
- From September 2025 there is NO HEADING allowed in ANY primary age competition, in line with local county ESFA rules. See below rules on deliberate headers.

If a player heads the ball an indirect free kick will be awarded from where the ball was headed.

If the player heads the ball inside their own penalty area the free kick will take place from the nearest side line of the penalty area where the header took place.

 From September 2025 there is NO THROW INS allowed in ANY primary age competition, instead the below rules apply when the ball leave the field of play from the side line.

When the whole of the ball passes over the whole of the touchline, on the ground or in the air, instead of a throw-in, a pass-in/dribble-in is awarded.

The kicker that takes the pass-in/dribble-in may touch the ball again before it is touched by another player.

At the moment of delivering the ball:

The ball must be stationary on the touchline at the point where it left the pitch; only the kicker may be off the pitch.

All opponents must stand at least five yards from the point on the touchline where the pass-in or /dribble-in is to be taken from.

A goal cannot be scored directly from a pass-in. The ball is in play when it is kicked and clearly moves.

- Other normal football rules for these age groups apply, including no offside.
- From a goal kick the opposing team must retreat behind the half way line.
- Back pass rules applies (Goalkeepers cannot pick up the ball when receiving it from a player deliberately). An indirect free kick will be awarded.
- The winners of the group will go through to the knockout stage. Depending on group size top 2 may advance, this will be clarified when the groups are drawn.
- League games 3 points for a win, 2 for draw and 1 for a loss.

- If two teams are joint on points at the end of the group games, the head to head
 result will decide which team goes through. If tied on head to head then the team
 who have conceded the least number of goals will progress. If tied on number of
 goals conceded, then goal difference will be used. If still tied a play off game will
 take place.
- If a team achieves a 5 goal lead in any match the match is officially over at that point with that score being recorded as the final score. Schools are encouraged to continue playing but to change the rules, e.g. mix the teams or add more players onto the losing side or implement different rule restrictions for the winning side, however the game MUST NOT continue as it had been prior.
- Deadlines are final and any games not played will be registered as 0-0, unless a school can show they have tried to arrange the game and the opposition have either not replied or pulled out on an arranged date and been unable to agree upon a new date. In this scenario the team who did not pull out will be awarded a 1-0 win.
- If you are withdrawing from the competition inform the below contact and any schools you are due to play.

Tony Moore Plate (Year 5/6 Girls' Div 2)

This academic year we are introducing a girls' development league, the Tony Moore Plate. This league is designed to help girls learn to play and provide an appropriate level of competition for new players. As such, if you wish to enter a team into this league please ensure that the majority of your team are new players/girls who only play in school and not in a club outside of school.

Rules

- Schools are able to enter this league AND the Tony Moore Shield, provided both teams meet the criteria for those leagues.
- 5 players on pitch including goalkeeper, rolling subs are allowed from your squad of 8. The referee must be informed of any changes that are made.
- All other rules are the same as the Kirby Shield/Plate/Tony Moore Shield, please refer above to these.

Mixed Kirby Shield Year 5/6 & Girls' Tony Moore Shield Year 5/6

- Entries close 15th September 2025 12pm (17th September for Tony Moore Plate) - enter via website
- Draw will take place on the 18th or 19th September 2025
- Group games to be played by Christmas break.
- Quarter/Semi Finals to be played by 18th March 2026
- Kirby Shield & Plate Finals to be held on the 15th April 2026 at Coalville Town F.C.
 - (Kirby Plate at 11am and Kirby Shield at 1pm)
 Tony Moore Shield & Tony Moore Plate provisional date for final is 21st April at Coalville Town F.C. (Tony Moore Plate at 11am and Tony Moore Shield at 1pm).
- Play with a size 4 ball

In addition, when attending youth games I will:

- Let the coaches do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do

- Never criticise a player for making a mistake: mistakes are part of learning

I understand that failure to follow this code of conduct may result in any of the following actions; my removal from the pitch side, my child being unable to continue playing, the team being removed from the competition, and my ban from future games.
